"I want to make a wadaiko club in Hirosho."

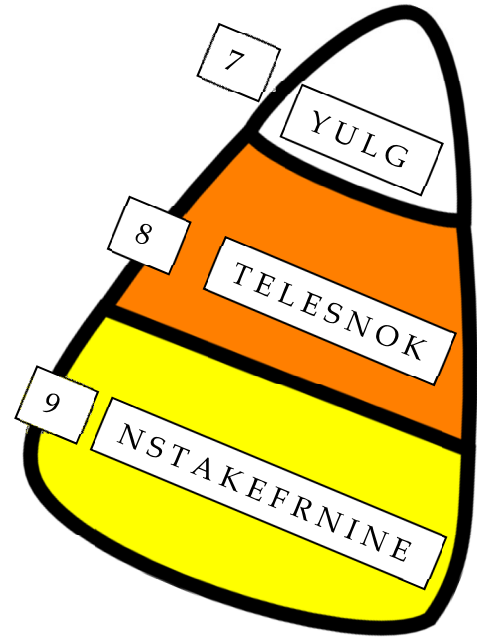
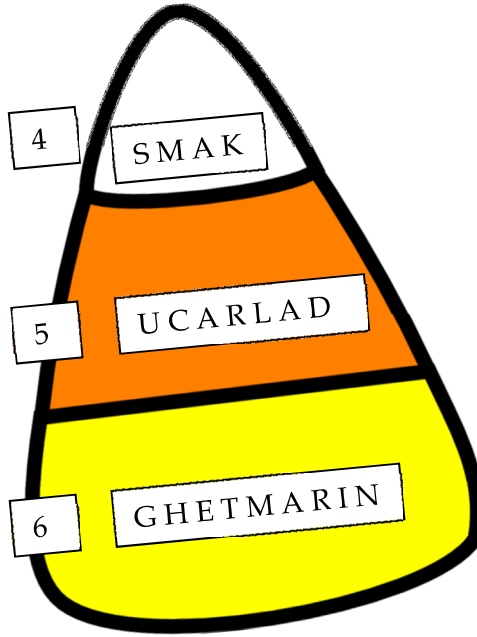
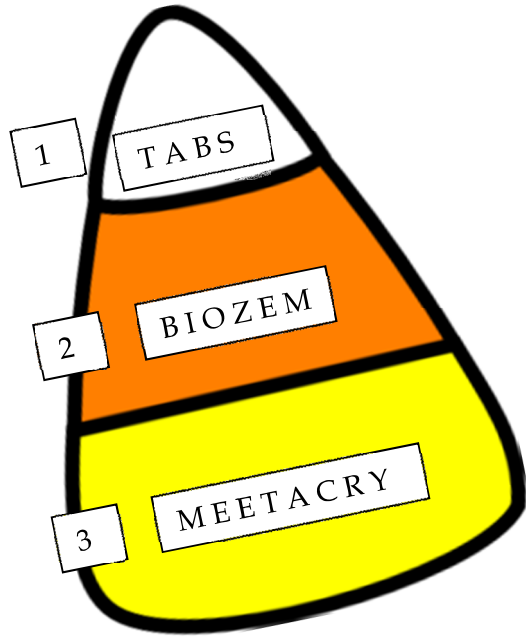
"I thought wadaiko is boring, but it is very fun."
